
This month I was pleased to be able to publish the location maps for the remaining categories of disused coal tips in Wales – category A, B and R tips. These maps are available at: Find disused coal tips.

Category A, B and R tips are much less likely to impact public safety. There are more than 2,500 disused tips in Wales, and we believe it is important to be transparent about their locations with the public.

I also provided an update on the Welsh Building Safety Programme. The Building Safety (Wales) Bill is still set to be introduced within this Senedd term as promised. This bill aims to establish a more comprehensive building safety regime than the one in England, covering all multi-occupied residential buildings with two or more units, irrespective of height. The government is focusing on ensuring resident voices are central to the regime, with local authorities playing a key role in its implementation. The initiative represents a substantial step forward in enhancing building safety and accountability.

Many of you have got in touch about the closed list system in the new Senedd Elections Bill. The newly proposed closed-list system aims to make every vote count, moving away from the less proportionate first-past-the-post system. Parties will select a list of candidates, rather than the single candidates they choose now & voters can still choose independent ones. Endorsed by two-thirds of the Senedd, the system includes a post-2026 election review. Welsh Labour is committed to working with stakeholders to encourage diverse candidacies, offering engagement and training support to ensure political representation truly reflects Wales' diverse population.

The ambitious Charter will create a joined-up system, where individuals will only have to tell their story once in order to access all the benefits that they are entitled to.

This new approach puts the needs of the individual at the centre of a system which has historically been seen as intimidating and difficult to navigate.

The Charter has seen huge support across Wales, with all 22 local authorities endorsing it.

Since the launch, progress has already been underway to turn what is written into the Charter's commitments into reality.

The NHS will benefit from £10 million of additional funds to upgrade a variety of digital equipment, infrastructure and services. The funding will include £5 million for digital services to modernise and boost the efficiency of IT, £1 million to upgrade MRI scanners and £1.3 million dedicated to ultrasound scanning equipment. The Welsh Government and Welsh NHS are facing very tough financial pressures and difficult decisions are being made. Against this backdrop, I welcome this funding which will improve the experiences of many patients across the country.



14-16 learning

Parents and carers have unique and crucial insights into how the young adults they support are adapting to the world around them, and what support and skills would be helpful for them to learn as they approach adulthood.

The Welsh Government will listen to those opinions in a new consultation, asking for views on 14-16 learning under the Curriculum for Wales.
