
- A Healthier Wales reducing NHS waiting times, especially in mental health, and improving access to social care and women's health services.

Updates



£900,000 is being made available to support public and third sector organisations.

The Welsh Government is providing grants to eligible organisations/groups of up to a maximum of up to £5,000, £25,000 and £100,000 depending on the grant scheme the organisation/group applies for.

The pieces of work being funded will strengthen the capacity of organisations to form collaborative working arrangements to address child poverty, linked to one or more of the 5 objectives of the Child Poverty Strategy for Wales, improve communication and knowledge transfer in addressing child poverty at the regional, local or community level.



I am delighted to see positive progress being made in communications between the Senedd and Westminster regarding the future of Welsh rail. This progress includes a new commitment to the Government's working in partnership, alongside industry, to deliver a better service for Welsh passengers. The Welsh Labour Government's vision for public transport in Wales is an easy, accessible one that integrates our rail and bus systems: One Network, One Timetable, One Ticket



This summer's Eisteddfod was an enormous success, showcasing and celebrating incredible talent and rich culture from across the country.

The Eisteddfod is the largest

cultural festival of its kind in Europe. It is so important to ensure that events such as these are accessible. This year, the Welsh Labour Government provided £350,000 to the Eisteddfod, to enable individuals and families from lower income households to experience the festival.



Products supported by Creative Wales have topped both gaming and streaming charts. Audiences around the world have been able to engage with Welsh-related production, including: the world-renowned House of the Dragon, filmed across north Wales and employing 250 local people, BBC's Lost Boys and Fairies filmed predominantly in Cardiff, and game Sker Ritual which became one of the best selling console games in the world the week of it's launch.
