It was also great to meet the students at the Green Hwb in Gower College towards the end of December as well as speak at Trinity St. Davids Net Zero project and meeting with Jane Hutt, Cabinet Secretary for Social Justice at Swansea Council for Voluntary Service.

The Draft Budget announced last month by the Welsh Labour Government was full of hope and growth for Wales.

The biggest settlement has been announced since devolution. After 14 difficult years with a Tory UK Government, it is so encouraging to see the practical difference that two Labour Government's working together can have for the people of Wales.

The Draft Budget will deliver an extra £1.5 billion for our public services and provide an enormous boost to health and social care. This will help to assist cuts to the longest waiting times in our NHS and the creation of more appointments. The Draft Budget is investing in children and young people, with more than £100 million dedicated to the education budget. £181.6 million will go to improving Welsh rail services.

The Draft Budget will be voted on in the Senedd in March 2025.

More people in Wales will be supported to buy their own home with the Help to Buy Wales scheme. I know that for many different circumstances becoming a homeowner might seems like an overwhelming challenge, but this scheme could help you get there. Since it launched, the Help to Buy Wales scheme has enabled more than 14,000 people to become homeowners. Welsh Labour are committed to helping more people gaining secure housing. The scheme will now be extended until September 2026. Anyone interested in the scheme can find out more here.



I am thrilled that the Women's Health Plan for Wales has been published—a bold 10-year vision to improve health care for women and girls. This plan focuses on eight key areas, including endometriosis, menopause, violence against women and girls, and long-term conditions.



In another positive step forward in environmental protection, the supply of single-use vapes in Wales will end on June 1st 2025. This will mean less waste is generated, less litter and plastic pollution on our streets and in landfills, and greater protection of our wildlife and nature.
